What is biblical worldview?


- Looking at the world through the lens of the Bible
- Shaping every area of life according to principles found in scripture
- A view that believes that all truth ultimately comes from God who has revealed himself through his written word and through the person of Jesus Christ



Biblical inerrancy

- **2nd timothy 3:16** "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness."
- **Psalms 12:6** the words of the lord are pure words, like silver refined in a furnace on the ground, purified seven times (in this scripture we see the claim of God word being pure and reliable)
- **Proverbs 30:5** every word of God proves True he is a shield to those who take refuge in him (in this verse we see the truthfulness of his word)






Does an absolute moral truth exist?

- **Morality:** Principles concerning the distinction between right and wrong or good and bad behavior.
- **Subjective truth:** A truth that is based on a person's feelings, opinions, or perspective. It can also be defined as how a person experiences or sees the world
- **Objective truth** - A fact that is true regardless of personal opinion or belief

In the context of the Bible absolute truth refers to the belief that all aspects of truth are fixed and unchanging because they are rooted in the nature and character of God


- **Divine Origin:** Biblical absolute truths are believed to be given by God and are therefore timeless and universal. They are not subject to human opinions or cultural changes.
- **Moral Absolutes:** The Bible contains commandments and teachings that outline what is considered morally right and wrong. For example, the Ten Commandments provide a set of moral absolutes, such as "You shall not murder" and "You shall not steal."
- **Objective Reality:** Biblical absolute truths are seen as objectively true, meaning they are true regardless of whether individuals or societies recognize or accept them.
- **Authority of Scripture:** The Bible is regarded as the authoritative source of these absolute truths. Believers turn to Scripture to understand and apply these truths to their lives.
- **Consistency:** Because these truths are based on the unchanging nature of God, they remain consistent over time. What was true according to the Bible in the past is still considered true today.




What is the Big Bang theory?



- **The Big Bang is a physical theory that describes how the universe expanded from a primordial state of high density and temperature ^[1] It was first proposed as a physical theory in 1931 by roman catholic priest and physicist George Lemaitre when he suggested the universe emerged from a "primeval atom"**
- a single particle—the "primeval atom" as he called it— which disintegrated in an explosion, giving rise to space and time and the expansion of the universe that continues to this day.
- The belief that the entirety of creation came from a single atom as it exploded and spread
- Let's look at the creation story in the Bible the first 5 verses of the book of genesis





What is theistic evolution ?

- belief that combines the religious concept of divine creation with the scientific theory of evolution. It suggest that God or a higher power guides the process of evolution to bring about life as we know it.



Two types of evolution

- Micro evolution – small scale changes within a species or population
- Macro evolution- large scale evolutionary changes that occur at or above the level of species. This involves the formation of a new species
